#### **From the Director**

Cappella Cantorum's 45th anniversary season continues Sunday, Dec. 7, 3 pm. with a performance of Bach's Magnificat and Vivaldi's Gloria at St. Mark the Evangelist R.C. Church, 222 McVeagh Road, Westbrook. Composer Richard Wagner called the Magnificat "the most stupendous miracle in all music." The Gloria is Vivaldi's best known sacred work and is a joyful hymn of praise and worship. Soloists will be Patricia Schuman, Heather Petrie, Fredrick Goff and Thomas Mullaney. In the spirit of the season, the audience will be invited to sing Christmas carols with the chorus. Advance tickets are \$25 on-line at Cappella Cantorum.org or may be purchased by calling 860-577-2950. Tickets the day of the concert will be \$28 at the door. Reception will follow.

The annual *Messiah* Sing or Listen sponsored by Cappella is set for Sunday, Dec. 21, 4 p.m. at The Katharine Hepburn Cultural Arts Center, 300 Main St., Old Saybrook. All singers are welcome and will rehearse at 3:30 p.m. Professional soloists will highlight the performance. Barry Asch will conduct with Deborah Lyon accompanying. ## Free lecture on 'Magnificat' and 'Gloria' Nov. 23



One of the shoreline's favorite speakers on all things musical, James Kuslan of New York City, will give a free lecture Sunday, Nov. 23, 3 p.m. at Hamilton Hall, Essex Meadows, 30 Bokum Road, Essex. Kuslan has been described as a brilliant, engaging speaker with a wonderful sense of humor. He will focus on Bach's *Magnificat* and Vivaldi's *Gloria* to be performed by Cappella Cantorum Masterworks Chorus Sunday, Dec. 7.

Kuslan has given talks along the shoreline on several musical subjects. He gave lectures on opera works at the Essex Library in 2010, on Verdi female characters and *Don Pasquale* at the Old Lyme Phoebe Griffin Noyes Library in 2012 and 2013, and on "Operatic

Disasters" at Essex Meadows in 2013. He is also known internationally for his essays that accompany the DVDs of the Metropolitan Opera's recent productions of *Lucia di Lammermoor* and *Don Pasquale* and as a writer of notes for London's 20 CD collection, *Opera Made Easy*. He is now co-writing the memoirs to Tito Capobianco, the legendary stage director who contributed immeasurably to the great days of the New York City Opera.
